COMMUNICATING WITH PUBLIC OFFICIALS

When you write, the following tips may help.

1. Identify a bill by proper name, contents or number.
2. State personal position and give reasons.
3. Time the letter to arrive when issue is current.
4. Write letters of commendation when officials do things of which you approve.

VOTING INFORMATION

You are qualified to vote if:

1. You are a citizen of the United States.
2. You are 18 years of age.
3. You are a resident of the State of Michigan for 30 days.
4. You are registered by your city, township or village.
5. Photo identification is required at the polls OR affidavit.

Absentee Voting

Any registered voter who cannot go to the polls because of physical disability, absence from his/her city, by reason of being 60 years of age or older, or other statutory reason, may apply either in person or by mail to the Clerk of his city, township or village as early as 75 days before and up to 2:00 p.m. of the Saturday preceding an election for an Absentee Ballot. The ballot must be returned to the Clerk in sufficient time so that it can be counted in the precinct by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

How to register to vote

Apply during regular business hours to the Clerk of your city, township, or village; at your local Secretary of State Office; at state agencies, like the Department of Community Health, Department of Human Services, etc.; military recruitment centers; voter registration drives; or online at www.Michigan.gov/sos.

The thirtieth day preceding an election is the deadline for registering to vote in that election. Moving within the Pointes requires re-registration, as does a change of name. First time mail-in registrants, under age 60, must vote in person, and cannot vote absentee unless they appear before the City Clerk prior to an election.

VOTING HOURS: 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Running for Local Office

Prospective candidates for city council, school board, or municipal judge should consult their city clerk for requirements and filing dates.
